



Do the Olympics need updating? (Primary & Secondary) 10th July 2020 – 17th July 2020









*Votes collected as "Diverse" include students that identify as gender diverse, as well as students that wish not to disclose their gender.

Both in **Primary and Secondary schools, female students had the smallest percentage of Yes votes**, followed by male students and gender diverse students, who in both cases had the biggest percentage of Yes votes to the question "Do the Olympics need updating?".

In **Primary schools, 3.3% more male pupils voted Yes, compared to female voters. Gender diverse pupils** had the biggest percentage of Yes votes, with **10.27%** more voting Yes, compared to females.


In **Secondary schools** this difference was slightly more subtly with **1.44% more male students voting Yes, compared to female voters** and **5.15% more diverse students Voting Yes**, when comparing the vote to female students.

Students' Comments:
